Responsibilities:

- Work with an EMAT intern as a co-teacher in your classroom for the entire school year.
- Provide constructive feedback to your EMAT intern on an ongoing basis.
- Introduce and maintain a co-teacher relationship with your intern as you gradually release one section/class of your schedule to your EMAT intern (similar to having a student teacher)
- Model strategies of strong instructional practice for EMAT intern.
- Attend monthly professional development sessions facilitated by NYU. These PD sessions will be structured as a PLC and will total approximately 90 minutes accomplished during 2-3 meeting times per month.
- Provide school updates, mentee progress, and other input relevant to the EMAT program to the school building liaison and/or EMAT Residency Director (NYU staff) via email or face to face meetings.
- Engage in personal goal setting around the reflective work of being a mentor teacher.
