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Principal's Message

It's hard to believe we are entering the last few weeks of school. Please review the following information carefully and also note that we will hold regular sessions (7:50 a.m. to 3:05 p.m.) through the last day of school, Thursday, June 21.

Enclosed is your child's fourth quarter interim report card. Please review it, and if you have any questions or concerns, you may call the Guidance Office at (518) 475-6486 for assistance.

As we rapidly approach the end of the 2017-18 school year, we will continue to enforce behavior expectations in order to maintain a safe and orderly environment. We expect all students to arrive at school and each class period on time. While this is not a new expectation, it is one that we will continue to enforce in order to maximize academic time and minimize

disruptions and disturbances.

At this time of the year, maintaining a safe and orderly environment is a critical issue. Attending the Moving-Up Ceremony, the Eighth-Grade Dance, school trips and other events are privileges, not requirements. Therefore, our administrative team and/or academic teams will determine if a student's behaviors are consistent with school expectations. Students who have engaged in ongoing disruptive behavior, have poor attendance and/or are not achieving academic success will not be allowed to participate in these events.

We would like to commend our music staff and students on their wonderful performance at our annual Spring Concert which took place on May 7. We thank them for sharing their beautiful sounds with us at our final concert of the school year.

During our annual locker clean-out, students will be given the opportunity during their eighth-period class to remove all unnecessary items and materials from their lockers and return textbooks. The following dates have been tentatively assigned for each grade level: grade 6, June 21; grade 7, June 20; and grade 8, June 19. When school ends on June 21, ALL lockers must be cleaned out completely, and students must bring home all personal items. The school will not be held responsible for items left behind after June 21.

In these final weeks of school, I ask for your assistance in reinforcing appropriate dress with your child or children. Students are not allowed to wear brief garments such as strapless tops, crop tops, net tops, halter-tops, tanks with spaghetti straps, etc.

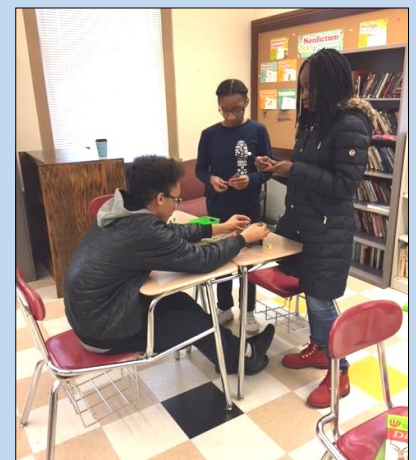
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Saturday School a Success

Thank you to the many parents who came to support their children. On Friday, June 22, we will celebrate our Class of 2018 Moving-Up Ceremony. The ceremony is scheduled to begin at 9 a.m. and will be held in our auditorium. In order for an eighth-grade student to participate in the ceremony, (walk across the stage), he/she must pass ALL core and special area courses and be in good

behavioral standing. Mandatory rehearsals will be held during school on Wednesday, June 20 and Thursday, June 21 during periods 1-4. Students who meet graduation requirements MUST be in attendance at BOTH rehearsals in order to walk across the stage. Anyone dismissed from rehearsal due to poor behavior will NOT be permitted to participate in the ceremony.

There will be a New Family Orientation and Creative Arts Festival at 6 p.m. on Wednesday, May 16 for eighth-grade students and families planning on attending Albany High School next school year. Shorts and dresses must be of a moderate length and should not be shorter than fingertip. In addition, students are required to wear appropriate footwear at all times. Slippers, flip-flops, platforms and heels of an unsafe height pose a safety issue and are unacceptable. Students identified as being dressed inappropriately will be referred to their respective administrator. If additional clothing or footwear is not available to the student, parents will be called.

Students who must attend summer school in order to be eligible for grade 9 will not be allowed to attend the graduation ceremony. Students must successfully complete the program in order to be promoted to the next grade. Please note there will not be a summer school graduation. Summer school for students in grades 6-8 will be held at Myers Middle School July 9-Aug. 10 from 8:30 a.m.-11:30 a.m. The program will run Monday-Friday with breakfast and lunch served daily.
